KNOWING THE FIRE DANGER RATING MAY SAVE YOUR LIFE

Fire Danger Ratings are now simpler and easier to understand. By using the latest science and technology, they provide a more clear and accurate rating to save properties and lives.

The Fire Danger Ratings give you an indication of the consequences of a fire, if a fire was to start.

The higher the rating is, the more dangerous the conditions will be.

The Fire Danger Ratings have four levels, which are:

- > There's a heightened risk. Be alert for fires in your area.

 The safest option is to avoid bush fire risk areas.


- > These are dangerous fire conditions.
- > Check your bush fire plan and that your property is fire ready.
-) If a fire starts, take immediate action. If you and your property are not prepared to the highest level, go to a safer location well before the fire impacts.
- > Reconsider travel through bush fire risk areas.
- > These are the most dangerous conditions for a fire.
- > Your life may depend on the decisions you make, even before there is a fire.
- Stay safe by going to a safer location early in the morning or the night before.
- Homes cannot withstand fires in these conditions. You may not be able to leave and help may not be available.

NO RATING: On days when there's minimal risk, the white bar meaning 'No Rating' will be used. Report any fires to 000.

GUIDE FOR PARENTS to the 2024-2025 Bushfire Season

What to do when:

A FIRE DANGER RATING OF CONCERN IS FORECAST.

A CATASTROPHIC FIRE DANGER is forecast for a school day. DO NOT SEND YOUR CHILD TO SCHOOL.

- A catastrophic fire danger warning is not issued until 4:30pm on the day prior.
- School will temporarily cease operations.
- Monitor SkoolBytes portal, Class Dojo and the NSW School Updates app for information from the school regarding arrangements.

A SEVERE or EXTREME FIRE DANGER is forecast for a school day or when Mount Keira is smoke affected on a school day.

CHILDREN CAN COME TO SCHOOL.

- School will operate in a limited and high alert capacity (only indoor activities).
- Pack extra water bottles.
- Parents of children with asthma should consider keeping children at home.
- Parents to monitor Skoolbytes portal, Class Dojo and the NSW Education
 website https://education.nsw.gov.au/schooling/school-operational-status for
 information on changing situations from the school.

YOUR CHILD IS AT SCHOOL and...

- there is a fire in the Mount Keira area.

or

- <u>burning embers are falling in the Mount Keira area.</u>

In consultation with Emergency Services, the school will:

1. Lockdown

- Children to be sheltered in the Learning Centre on the grounds of Mount Keira Demonstration School.
- Monitor Skoolbytes portal, Class Dojo and the NSW Education website
 <u>https://education.nsw.gov.au/schooling/school-operational-status</u> for
 information from the school.
- **DO NOT COME TO OUR SCHOOL TO COLLECT YOUR CHILD** until the school sends a message indicating it is safe to do so. Once you enter school grounds you must remain onsite and will also be placed into lockdown.
- **DO NOT RING OUR SCHOOL** as this engages vital phone lines.

OR

2. Relocate

- Children to be relocated by walking to the nearest bus stop where buses will provide transport to Edmund Rice College.
- Monitor SkoolBytes portal, Class Dojo and the NSW Education website
 <u>https://education.nsw.gov.au/schooling/school-operational-status</u> for
 information from the school.
- DO NOT COME TO OUR SCHOOL TO COLLECT YOUR CHILD. Collect your child after the relocation, from Edmund Rice College, when the school sends a message indicating it is the time to do so.
- DO NOT RING OUR SCHOOL UNLESS URGENT as this engages vital phone lines.
