

This area will be used on 7 November as part of our outdoor classroom day.

At our P and C meeting on Tuesday evening it was wonderful to reflect on the achievements of the community and to commence planning for the new year ahead. Thank you to those parents who were able to find time in their busy schedules to attend.

At our working bee on Saturday we again had many parents and students working in the gardens. The most wonderful surprise for the teachers though, was the refurbishment of the courtyard outside the Principal's office, an area that Mrs Travis's stage 1 class uses. They now have a sink in which to wash their paint brushes and for lessons in science and maths. The wall has been converted to a chalkboard and there are places for children to sit. It is absolutely beautiful and will be a much used space. The teachers, Mrs Robinson and I are so thankful to you all for making this space so inviting for our children to use for so many educational experiences. Please pop in and have a look at this beautiful learning space.







We are getting some more mulch delivered on Wednesday to continue the beautification and droughtproofing of our gardens. If anyone could help out with the spreading of the mulch it would be greatly appreciated as we would like to get all the gardens looking great before Kinder Orientation.

MKDS Concert/Final Showcase

Our final showcase preparations are well and truly underway and once again I commend the Stage 3 students who are spending their breaks rehearsing and choreographing and teaching songs and dances. They are so enthusiastic and it is a joy to watch as they work with the younger children - although I occasionally have to rein their ideas in. This is one of the many advantages of a small school when children can take on leadership roles and show initiative. I believe that this helps to equip them well for life in high school enabling them to develop confidence and to be able to think for themselves.

Teachers will send a Class Dojo with costume requirements this week.

Rich Tasks

This term **Wattle** is focussing on letter formation and sentence structure in writing. We will be making a building using different materials in Science and Technology.

In **Lilli Pilli** we are looking at how things blend together to create different mixtures. We are investigating how different substances combine and make different things. For our Rich Task students

will be mixing up a 'potion' of their own. They will need to make it, label it and write about how it was made and what it does.

In writing we are looking at writing imaginative stories. We have been looking at lots of different fairy tales that students will be using to create their own fractured fairy tale. Students will need to create their own characters, setting and series of events and write an entertaining story for their class. Students will then publish and illustrate their work.

In **Waratah**, we have been given the job of designing the packing that will allow a postman to deliver a very fragile package. The contents of the package (a biscuit and an egg) must arrive in one piece and must be able to withstand a long journey through very cold and very wet territory.

We have been looking at a variety of packing, and discussing the purpose of the packing, materials, design and reasons for these choices.

You won't find students in Waratah this semester, but industrial designers!

In writing, our focus this term is Poetry. We are looking at Poetic devices that are used by poets and having fun deconstructing and analysing poems, as well as writing our own.

Throughout Term 4, the students in **Banksia** will be researching natural disasters in Geography. This learning will be led by Mrs Sartori on a Thursday afternoon and continued throughout the week.

In Science and Technology students have begun investigating Light, how it is formed, the speed at which it travels and what happens when it meets particular surfaces.

PDH is focused on keeping safe in different environments - at home, in rural settings, around our school and in the community. They are conducting audits of some unsafe areas and discovering what advances in technology and research have been made to improve the safety of others.

Poetry is the writing focus for English and it is anticipated that students will create a collection of original poems throughout the term to display in our school library. Drama will be integrated into this area with students creating dramatic pieces that reflect aspects of their poems.

We welcome back to the school our PEX students who will complete their second professional experience on the same classes Lucy Staniforth who is working with Miss Green, Sam Ekland who is working with Miss Ford and Jack Swindells who is working with Mrs Gehrke. Mrs Travis's PEX student Jamie Stanley will begin next week. Please make them feel welcome.

us with the grants for these project. Following the opening assembly, we welcome parents and community members to a light refreshment in our new kitchen. It would be fabulous to see you all here on the day to celebrate a project that has been in the making for many years.

Free home-based assessment and treatment for 7 to 12 year old children with fear and anxiety disorders.

Does your child become very afraid of certain situations or objects, worry about a lot of things, get very distressed, or try to avoid things they fear?

About the study

Our team at Griffith University may be able to assist you. We are conducting a nationwide study that includes the following services at no cost to families:

- A thorough assessment of your child's anxiety with a trained psychologist via the telephone;
- Your child receiving one of two kinds of homebased treatments delivered on a PC, laptop or tablet; and
- Two follow-up telephone assessments with a trained psychologist 6- and 12-months after treatment to track your child's progress.

The study aims to find out if these two treatments are as effective as each other, and which children have the best response to each kind of treatment. This will mean that there are more evidence-based treatments available for helping anxious children.

About the treatments

Each treatment involves your child completing treatment sessions at home on a PC, laptop or tablet.

Each treatment involves your child learning practical strategies to better manage anxiety.

- One treatment helps children learn to control the focus of their attention on helpful things around them.
- The other treatment helps children learn to think differently and approach things they fear.

Each treatment includes information, telephone or email support for parents in assisting their child to better manage anxiety.

Prior studies have shown that children who complete each treatment experience significant reductions in anxiety.
