National award winners


I am so proud to share with you all that on Thursday afternoon, I received an email from Christine Erskine, Executive Officer at KidSafe NSW stating that Mount Keira Demonstration had won the **NATIONAL** Playground Design Award for Infants and Primary Schools and was the overall winner of the Leycester Meares Memorial Award.

According to correspondence received, ALL Judges agreed on recognising our special play space. They believed the design incorporated creative approaches to utilising otherwise unusable space to create 'learning' pockets and physical challenges for students.

They went on to say the use of recycled and repurposed materials was impressive, resulting in a play space that demonstrates a respect and connection to nature and the local and Indigenous communities.

It was decided the design introduced a range of both free play, self-directed learning and formal outdoor learning spaces and different environments for students to intentionally or inadvertently spend time in more interactive natural settings.





The KidSafe playground awards are held every two years to recognise excellence and innovation in the provision of safe, creative playspaces across Australia. The awards aim to promote inspirational, innovative, best practice play facilities that encourage healthy participation in recreational activities for all children.

This is a huge achievement for our school and the team behind its design. Ben from PlaygroudEd and I submitted an application in May for this annual award with high hopes that our play spaces would be recognised for their design however we never expected to win the National award. We are so fortunate to have so many wonderful play spaces for our children to learn, discover and explore in each and every day.

Well done to all involved and a special thanks to Ben from PlaygroundEd.

Class of the week- Lilli Pilli

Last week Lilli Pilli enjoyed listening to and reading stories of the Dreaming. We looked at common symbols used in artworks and used this to create our own piece. These artworks show the students' representation of our school from a birds eye view and we used the amphitheatre as our meeting place.



NAIDOC Week 2020 – Always was. Always will be.

NAIDOC week was recognised and celebrated at MKDS last week. All classes shared daily Dreamtime stories, read 'The Story of Five Islands' in the outdoor learning spaces and created some amazing artworks that reflected their knowledge of Indigenous culture.

We also had a fabulous excursion to the National Park where we received first-hand learning experiences from Uncle Shane, a local Aboriginal Elder from Country. Many of the students made their own artworks, had a bush walk to important sites and the younger students even got to build a 'gunya' using natural materials. It was a truly marvellous day for all that participated.



End of year activities

We are currently finalising our end of year events, ensuring they meet the most current COVID guidelines. The new guidelines allow for parents to be involved only when the physical space allows for 1.5m distancing and 4m² per individual. This included students, staff and visitors.

To be COVID safe and compliant, we need to plan all arrangements on the total number of students and staff likely to attend before we can invite visitors. This requirement means, we will only be able to invite Year 6 parents to our end of year **Graduation Assembly**. There will be a limit of two adults per child to ensure we maintain social distancing. More information on the exact details will be sent home in the coming weeks.

Mrs Gehrke and our Year 6 students have been busy planning our **Year 6 Farewell Dinner**. Unfortunately this event will look different from previous years as it will now be taking place at school during lunchtime. The students will still be able to celebrate in style and reflect on their time here at Mount Keira Demonstration School. Letters and information will be sent home in the coming weeks.

Finally in regards to our **end of year concert**, we have unfortunately had to make the very tough decision to cancel this annual event. We are currently looking at the possibility of streaming individual class items and will advise of the outcome in the coming weeks.

Out of School Hours Care parent survey- a message from the Dept of Education

We want to offer families more flexibility with their work commitments and child care arrangements and to create more opportunities across the whole community. Having Out of School Hours Care available at local schools is a great way to achieve this.

As part of the NSW Government's \$120 million Before and After School Care (BASC) commitment, parents at all NSW schools were recently invited to complete a Have Your Say survey. The survey asked parents to tell us how they are using Out of School Hours Care, how much it costs them, whether they plan to keep using it, and what difficulties they experience in accessing it. The survey results have helped us to better understand the needs of families and what's important to them.
