


Wattle staffing for 2022

Special Education in Ethics (SEE)

The Ethics program needs some volunteers to teach the classes at Mt Keira. We will only be able to offer the Stage 3 class in Term 4 as a number of our volunteer teachers are no longer available. We rely on parents, grandparents and community minded people to become volunteer ethics teachers in

at our school. It is a rewarding way to be involved in your local community, learn new things and help children develop skills for life. Comprehensive training, access to lesson materials and classroom support are all provided. Previous teaching experience is not required.

Ethics classes support children to develop the skills they need to voice their opinions, consider the ideas of others and to make decisions based on evidence and reasoning rather than habit or peer pressure. In Ethics classes, children discuss ethical issues using an approved curriculum designed for each age group and include topics such as laziness, voting, empathy and how can we work out what is true? Volunteers are needed now to teach ethics classes at Mt Keira. Training and support is provided.
