Staffing News

In Semester 2, we will see the return of both Allira Robinson and Ashlea Travis from maternity leave to their permanent teaching roles. This means we will have changes to our current staffing and class arrangements. These changes will be communicated to our school community by the end of this term when these arrangements are finalised. We look forward to welcoming back both of these highly experienced teachers to our teaching staff.

Curriculum Reform

The NSW Curriculum Reform is well underway with the release of the English K-2 Mathematics and English syllabuses for implementation in some schools beginning this year. The remaining curriculum documents for all Key Learning Areas K-6 are due to be available by 2024.

NESA has developed state-wide teacher expert networks (TENs) to ensure that the new curriculum connects with practice and works well in the classroom. TENs are networks of over 200 teachers from across NSW involved in curriculum reform. TENs teachers user-test new resources and provide feedback and advice to NESA on the new curriculum. TENs will also share knowledge about the new curriculum in their schools, regions and sectors. In 2021 Mrs May was fortunate enough to be selected as one of the 200 teachers across the state to engage in the TENs Network for three years. This valuable experience has enabled the teachers at Mount Keira Demonstration School to participate in the most current professional learning on the curriculum and to preview some of the new syllabus materials.

Our teachers here at Mount Keira Demonstration School engage in professional development activities each week. One of our main focus areas this year is the curriculum reform, and in particular, the English and Mathematics K-2 syllabus documents. The teachers have been involved in a range of familiarisation activities to ensure we have the resources and understanding to implement the changes to our curriculum effectively. On the Staff Development Day, Miss Reskic and Mrs May presented a session to teachers of Mount Keira Demonstration School and Keiraville Public School focused on using quality texts to support students with

understanding and responding to literature. In addition, the teachers have been engaging in learning on the most current research-based models of effective reading instruction, including a systematic approach to teaching phonics. Our school has been selected to host the Curriculum Reform Community for the Wollongong North Network of more than 20 schools. Each term we will have leaders from a variety of public schools attending our school to engage in professional learning on the new curriculum - a very exciting opportunity for our school!

We will be holding some parent information sessions about the new K-2 syllabuses for English and Mathematics later in the year.

Quality Teaching Rounds

Earlier in the year, Mrs Gehrke and Miss Klasson attended professional learning on Quality Teaching Rounds (QTR) which is a department-endorsed, research-based, high-impact professional learning approach to improving teaching practice. It enhances participants' knowledge about the department's Quality Teaching model. Using the model, teachers and leaders engage in a process that enables them to collaborate effectively, so that they can continuously refine their quality teaching practice. It aims to support teachers to confidently lead and participate in small professional learning communities (PLC) focused on teaching improvement. This Thursday Mrs Gehrke and Miss Klasson will begin leading the teachers through their first Quality Teaching Round. We look forward to seeing this process in action to support quality teaching across our school.

Inclusive, engaging and respectful schools reforms

The Inclusive, Engaging and Respectful (IER) Schools package was announced in February this year by NSW Minister for Education and Early Learning, Hon Sarah Mitchell.

It centres on three new policies and procedures and a framework that together set the guidelines for how we ensure all children and young people can learn through public education in a safe and engaging way. The three new polices include:

- Inclusive Education Policy for students with disability
- Student Behaviour Policy and Procedures
- Restrictive Practices Framework and Restrictive Practices Reduction and Elimination Policy and Procedures.

With these new policies, we want all students to:

- be included in all aspects of school life and supported to learn to their fullest capability
- be supported in engaging, respectful, and effective classrooms with positive and inclusive practices
- feel welcomed, valued and safe in our schools and classroom

Strategic Direction 3 in our school's Strategic Improvement Plan 2021-2024 is focused on Wellbeing and Engagement for all. The staff and I are reviewing our current approach to all of the areas covered by these policies, and wish to share any changes we believe need to made with you by the end of this year.

Later this term on Tuesday 28 June we will be holding our first Rich Task Showcase for 2022. Each class will be sharing information and projects from their work throughout this term. Please come along and share in this celebration of student work and achievement.

National Walk Safely to School

Well it's that time of year again when our school seriously starts talking about walking! Walk Safely to School Day asks that we all consider our transport habits and try to incorporate more walking as part of a healthy, active way to get around. Although walking all the way to school isn't always realistic, it's quite easy to figure out how you can build a walk into your family's daily routine. You can teach your child the healthy habit of walking more by:



- Walking with them the whole way to school
- If they get the bus or train, walk past your usual stop and get on at the next stop
- If you have to drive, park the car down the street from the school and walk the rest of the way.

Regular exercise like walking with your child not only helps them (and you!) beat chronic problems like obesity, heart disease, behavioural and mental health issues and diabetes. It also gives you a great opportunity to teach your child safe ways to behave around roads and traffic.

MKDS have registered for National Walk Safely to School Day. We are encouraging all students to walk safely to school this Friday morning. The SRC students will be serving breakfast at our school kitchen from 8:45-9:15am. There will be a range of fresh fruit as well as some cereal served with lite milk. The event will take place during the last week of Term 3, and the time trials running along a city circuit from Monday 19 to Friday 23 September, will affect the operations of a number of schools in the Wollongong area, to varying degrees.

Representatives from the NSW Department of Education are currently working with affected schools, UCI, Wollongong City Council, the State Government and Transport on a plan to support the event and minimise disruption to each school as much as possible.

Schools impacted will have a unique plan developed in consultation with key stakeholders, factoring access for students and staff. Special arrangements will be communicated when finalised. We ask for your patience, understanding and support while these arrangements are decided upon.
