Dear Parents/Carers,

This term is flying by and the students are very busy getting prepared for the Rich Task Showcase on Tuesday 28 June. This showcase will give our students the opportunity to show the knowledge, understanding and skills that they have acquired over the past term. The afternoon will commence at 2:15pm with a short assembly underneath the COLA. This will then be followed by an open class session, where parents can visit classrooms and outdoor areas to view student work.

This is a great opportunity to get involved in your child's learning and celebrate their success and hard work. We look forward to seeing as many of you as possible on the day.

On Wednesday 29 June (Week 10), you will receive a copy of your child's Semester One report. Teachers make professional judgements, based on assessment data and teacher observation, about student achievement against the state-wide syllabus standards, particularly the syllabus outcomes and content. This professional judgement is done at key points in the learning cycle. The report will outline areas of student strength and learning progress as well as areas for further development and what can be done to support their learning growth. As always, we encourage you to speak to your child's teacher if you require any further information about how you can support your child with their learning.

Attendance at school is important for all students. When your child misses one day per fortnight, it equates to four weeks per year and by the end of their schooling, they will have missed over one year.

One day per week results in 2.5 years of missed education from K-12. It has long been known that for students to connect, succeed and thrive, they must have excellent attendance patterns.

Late arrivals and early departures also have a detrimental consequence on learning.

We understand that, on occasion, students may arrive late or need to depart early, but these must be kept to a minimum.

Schools impacted will have a unique plan developed in consultation with key stakeholders, factoring access for students and staff. Special arrangements will be communicated when finalised. We ask for your patience, understanding and support while these arrangements are decided upon.
