4. Treasurer's Report	 Please see attached Healthy position to be sitting in this year but huge fundraising goal to meet. Discussion about whether there should be a buffer left in the account, nothing official but NM's feelings are to leave at least \$2-3k in account. Some money left over from air filter fundraising that could potentially go towards fundraising. AN raised idea of KB and AN opening bank account specifically for playground fundraiser. A new bank account will be created where all fundraising from this year will be added, and a buffer will be left in the current account (for both learning deck and incidentals) Committee and financial members present at meeting agreed that Ashlee Jameson and Madeleine Morris will be added as signatories on P & C accounts.

7. Ongoing Business & Sub-Committee updates

7.1 Last meeting action items

- New paver order
- New paver order to roll out as soon as quotes from paving company are received. New families to receive paver order with Kindergarten transition information.

Action Item: Maddy to submit paver order form to Rose once paving company confirms unit prices.

- Playground grants subcommittee
- Some grants have been applied for this year. Looking for more people to take this on.
- Yearbook updates
- Franca, Ash and Grant on the committee. Working closely with Kate G and other parents to have this complete.

7.2 Outdoor update

- Lots of things flowering after all the rain.
- LZ looking to use coconut fibre logs in gully to retain parts of it. Can be ordered quickly if we go ahead with it. Mulch needs to be constantly topped but this will retain the edging and be a more sustainable option. LZ noted that money is currently available in cookbook/outdoor play space account which is used to maintain spaces (sensory path, etc.). Priority to reopen gully (currently closed due to incorrect level of mulch) as there is no playground equipment.
- LZ to check with KidsSafe NSW as to whether coconut fibre logs are suitable.

- LZ and AJ working to reduce waste across the school. Composted a huge amount of waste from UCI fundraiser and minimised what was destined for landfill. Kids are involved where possible.
- LZ suggested need to look at whether we are aiming for zero-waste as a P & C and as a school and what we need to be doing to make this happen.
- Seedling donations and harvesting have been happening, as well as no-dig beds, composting, signage (to indicate whether they are edible, etc. or not).

7.3 Fundraising update

- As above.
- AN suggested three different avenues for fundraising:
 - 1. Community grants
 - 2. Business callouts to community
 - 3. Generic fundraising

Action Item: AN going to look at establishing three committees (above) and asking parent community to join these committees.

MM suggested that we look at a Grants Coordinator as a position at next year's AGM.

SV suggested a community coffee/bake stall each term using outdoor kitchen to capitalise on bike/foot traffic heading up Mt Keira road. Suggestion was to make it a regular event so community are aware of when it is on. Discussion regarding whether cake stall or BBQ

Action Item: SV looking into coffee machine and possibility of having one donated. SV taking the lead on this initiative.

KG suggested using electric frypans in kitchen as an option – pikelets, etc.

7.4 Uniform update

VM showed proposed Summer uniform changes. Lots of discussion regarding whether the Winter uniform is required next year. Some members present raised concerns about too many options, particularly for girls.

After much discussion:

 2023 Kindergarten parents will be shown the new polo shirt, culottes and shorts that are to be rolled out Term 1, 2023. At this stage, a move to one annual uniform (both winter and summer) was agreed as a trial for 2023.
 Existing summer dress to stay until stock depleted and review new style in 2023.

- When cold, children can continue to wear the new polo with navy tracksuit pants (current sports) and existing jumper/jacket won't change.
- Uniform survey extended and a wider focus group suggested to refine Winter options, if at all required.
- White socks/black shoes
- New uniform to start in 2023, but people can transition in from now.

7.5 Monday Munchies

AN suggested rolling roster (same people remaining on roster from term to term) to reduce difficulty of finding volunteers each term.

8. New Business

8.1 SRC fundraising

- Amazing effort with fundraising this year!
- Halloween Disco held at school Monday 31st 2023.
- End of year Christmas Concert bake stall planned.
- Whole school behaviour reward with end of year reward day to celebrate.
- SRC presence very noticed at school and within the community this year very student-driven.

8.1 Behaviour Policy

State-wide implementation of Inclusive, Engaging and Respectful Schools policy. Has been pushed numerous times following consultation. Behaviour, disability and inclusion are a huge part of life at school. Wellbeing is paramount.

MKDS (and all schools) have been issued resources and support to implement new policies.

Previous 'Student Wellbeing Policy' has been removed from MKDS website as new policies have superseded this.

School values have been reviewed, simplified and rewritten so children understand them.

VM showed new flowcharts and values resources that are displayed through the school that both staff and students are currently following.

8.2 Heavy School Fees

VM echoed that these concerns have been raised during her time here. Suggested that Tell Them From Me survey is an ideal place to express their concerns.

KG noted that reducing school fees is simple enough to do – but it does mean that many opportunities would be removed (Scope IT, Uni Sports, etc.).

HT suggested that perhaps families are given a brief outline of expected fees for the term, so families have an idea of what to expect.

MKDS can offer financial assistance to parents who need them. There are exceptional circumstances that can be catered for, and families need to communicate this.

8.3 Progressive dinner – committee and plan

Decision has been made by majority present that Progressive Dinner to be postponed until Term 1 2023. MKDS are holding their school Christmas concert on Wednesday 30th November which will be a similar social gathering for families.

Proposed date for 2023 Progressive Dinner – revised to April 1st.

Committee to be convened late 2022/early 2023.

8.4 Wet Weather Plans (e.g. Book week cancelled)

Some parents have raised concerns around the cancelling of events because of forecasted rain, e.g. Book Week. VM and other staff outlines that some indoor restrictions are still in place by the Department for community events which makes it very difficult to run open classrooms, etc. (included in Book Week celebrations) with small indoor spaces.

Term 4 Principal Report

Assistant Principal, Curriculum and Instruction

Sharon Shanks from Jamberoo Public School was successful in the merit selection process for the Assistant Principal, Curriculum and Instruction role. She will be working at Mount Keira Demonstration School on Tuesdays next year. We look forward to welcoming Sharon to our school.

Staffing for 2023

We are currently looking at enrolments for next year and classing structures based on our enrolment figures. It is really important for families to let us know if they won't be returning next year. This also affects our staffing arrangements and allocations.

Both Allira Robinson and Ashlea Travis will be returning more days next year, and this means that there will only be two full time temporary teaching positions available. We are currently undergoing an Expression of Interest process to fill these roles for next year.

Playground Equipment

John, our GA has been able to remove the remaining poles from the fixed equipment. A request for temporary fencing has been made to our assets team so that we can secure the site while John removes the concrete and surfacing material.

Creative Recreation Solutions (based at Unanderra) came out to our school site last Thursday to do a site inspection for a quote. I have asked them to do a playground design/quote for \$50 000 and \$70 000, including the rubber surfacing. They will be organising a design team to work with us over the next few weeks.

Tell Them from Me - Parent Survey

The Tell Them from Me survey opened last Monday for Parents/Carers. This survey is done annually and provides valuable information and feedback to the school about your perspectives on your child's education and experiences. I encourage all families to complete the survey. We carefully consider the feedback in these surveys as it helps us look for ways to improve.

Uniform Plan

We have had an excellent response to the uniform survey that was sent out to parents and carers last term. If you haven't had a chance to complete the survey, it will be open until the end of this week.

Proposed plan (see presentation slides)

2023 - Introduction of new summer uniform and further consultation on winter uniform

2024 - Introduction of new winter uniform

2025 - Final year to phase in new uniform

Parent information evening - New curriculum

We would like to get an indication of parent interest in attending an information evening on the changes to the K-2 syllabuses for English and Mathematics. These are the two syllabuses that will be implemented in all schools next year. The 3-6 English and Mathematics syllabuses are coming next year for schools to start the familiarisation process with.

If we have enough interest, we are happy to hold an information evening to discuss the changes to our K-2 curriculum and what it looks like in our classrooms.

New policies

The Inclusive Education Policy for students with disability and the Student Behaviour Policy have become operational this term. Please see attached presentation slides for more information about the changes and our review processes. Tenae will continue with the consultation processes as we work towards finalising our School Behaviour and Support Management Plan by the end of Term 2 2023.
